

Schedule 1 Amendment of Firearms Regulation 2017

[1] Clause 59 Museum firearms permit

Omit "by any person (a *museum officer*) who is employed in, or who is otherwise engaged in the operation of, the public museum" from clause 59 (1).

Insert instead "and any related ammunition by the person".

[2] Clause 59 (2)

Omit "a museum officer". Insert instead "the permit holder".

[3] Clause 59 (2A)

Insert after clause 59 (2):

(2A) The authority conferred by a museum firearms permit also authorises an authorised museum officer to possess a firearm to which the permit relates and any related ammunition but only:

- (a) while on the premises of the public museum or for purposes reasonably connected with the operation of the public museum, and
- (b) under the supervision of the permit holder with that supervision to be as required by clause 156.

[4] Clause 59 (4) (a)

Omit the paragraph. Insert instead:

- (a) any prohibited firearm to which the permit applies must be rendered permanently inoperable.

[5] Clause 59 (4) (c) and (d)

Insert "and ammunition" after "firearms" wherever occurring.

[6] Clause 59 (4) (c1)

Insert after clause 59 (4) (c):

- (c1) in the case of ammunition to which the permit applies, the conditions set out in clause 74 (3).

[7] Clause 59 (5A) and (5B)

Insert after clause 59 (5):

(5A) Subclause (4) (a) and (b) do not require a firearm to be rendered permanently or temporarily inoperable if the Commissioner has exempted the particular firearm from the requirement by notice in writing to the permit holder or the person in charge of the public museum.

(5B) The Commissioner may grant an exemption under subclause (5A) if satisfied that the exemption is reasonable having regard to the particular firearm (for example, because of its age, value or general condition).

[8] Clause 59 (6)

Insert in alphabetical order:

authorised museum officer means a person who:

- (a) is employed in, or who is otherwise engaged in the operation of, the public museum, and
